**ICE Immigration Detainers** 

Dear Mr. Meyer,

The Sonoma County Sheriff's Office is evaluating its policy and practice of honoring immigration detainers issued by the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") in light of some recent court orders on that subject. (See, e.g. Galarza v. Szalczyk, Case No. 12-3991 (Third Circuit, March 4, 2014) and Miranda-Olivares v. Clackamas County, Case No. 02317-ST (United States District Court, Portland, Oregon, April 11, 2014)). These court orders clarify that ICE immigration detainers are non-mandatory requests only and that local law enforcement agencies are free to disregard ICE detainers. More importantly, these court orders suggest that local law enforcement agencies may be exposed to potential civil rights actions for honoring ICE detainers absent a showing of probable cause for the detention.

Therefore, please be advised that the Sonoma County Sheriff's Office will no longer honor ICE immigration detainers, in compliance with the Trust Act, unless ICE presents proof that it has probable cause for the detention, for example by providing an arrest warrant.
