

## I want to apply for DACA, but I may have a criminal record.

### What do I do?

Many people who have been arrested or convicted of a crime may still receive DACA. However, certain types of crimes will disqualify them. If you have ever been arrested or involved in any criminal activity, it is best to get legal advice on whether you are still eligible, and seek help putting together your application!

### How do I know if I have a criminal record?

If you have had any contact with law enforcement officers, you can request your criminal history to help you or your attorney figure out if you are eligible for DACA. This includes being stopped at the border when you entered the country, being in previous deportation proceedings, or being arrested or detained by local police. Even if it was all dismissed, there is a record and it is important to request it so that you know exactly what happened.

## How do I request my criminal record?

You can get your criminal record mailed to you by sending a request, with your fingerprints, to certain government agencies. Depending on what kind of record you may have, you should send your request to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), or to the California Department of Justice (CA DOJ).

## Where can I have my fingerprints taken?

For CA DOJ, you can have your fingerprints taken digitally at any of the CA List of Live Scan locations. See the attached list. For FBI records checks, you should use the FBI's ink card, and you can have your fingerprints taken on that card at some of the Live Scan locations, or at some other individual agencies as well. You can also go to the police or sheriff's department if you know that it is safe to do so in your community.

## **FBI Criminal and Immigration Record Check**

If you have ever been arrested or detained by federal law enforcement, including immigration officers at the border or in the United States, OR you have been arrested in a state other than California, request your U.S. Criminal History Summary from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

#### Steps:

- 1. Fill out the FBI Criminal History Summary Request form (see page 3 for the form)
  - a. If the request is for a couple, family, etc., all persons must sign the form.
  - b. Include your complete mailing address.
  - c. Please provide your telephone number and/or e-mail address, if available.
  - d. It is not necessary to answer all of the questions: only those with a star (\*)
  - e. Social Security number is optional: do not put one unless it is a valid SSN number
  - f. For "Reason for Request" you can choose: "personal review"
- 2. Have your fingerprints taken on the FBI form (see page 4 for the form)
  - a. Check the list of places to have your fingerprints taken
  - b. Call the fingerprinting service in your area and ask:
    - i. Do they provide ink card fingerprinting for FBI record checks?
    - ii. What is the fee for taking prints?
    - iii. What kind of ID is required?
  - c. Your name and date of birth must be provided on the fingerprint card.
- 3. Get a money order or cashier's check for \$18 made payable to the Treasury of the United States. Don't forget to sign it.
  - a. Cash, personal checks, or business checks are not accepted.
  - b. If the request is for a couple, family, etc., include \$18 for each person.
- 4. Send your request packet to the FBI:
  - a. fingerprint card
  - b. completed and signed request form
  - c. fee payment

5. It may take five or seeks weeks to receive your criminal history summary back from the FBI. If it takes longer, you can call the FBI's Customer Service Group at (304) 625-5590.

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## **California DOJ Criminal Records Check**

If you have ever been arrested or detained by law enforcement in California, such as the local police or sheriff, these are the instructions for submitting your request to the California Department of Justice to get a copy of your criminal history (record). For California residents only

## CA DOJ Records Requests requires:

- ✓ Digital fingerprint scan
- ✓ \$25 fee

## Steps:

- 1. Find the Live Scan location convenient for you.
  - a. Check the list of CA Live Scan sites
  - b. Call ahead to ask what forms of identification are accepted.
  - c. You may also want to double check their fee for taking prints
- 2. Fill out the Live Scan Form (Form BCIA 8016) (see page 6)
  - a. Check "Record Review" as the "Type of Application"
  - b. Enter "Record Review" on the "Reason for Application" line.
  - c. Fill out all your personal information.
  - d. Leave blank any questions you don't know the answer to
- 3. Take the completed form to any Live Scan site for fingerprinting services.
  - a. If needed, ask the Live Scan operators for assistance filling out the form
  - b. Live Scan means that the fingerprints are sent digitally to the DOJ from the Live Scan site
  - c. The Live Scan operator can accept your payment of \$25 to the DOJ
