Evidence in support of request:

- I. My Identity and Age (Under the age of 31 as of June 15, 2012):
 - a. Birth certificate and certified translation
 - b. Student ID card
 - c. Consular ID

- II. I Came to the United States before reaching 16th birthday:
 - a. School transcript
 - b. CA immunization record
 - c. Picture of elementary school soccer team

- III. I have continuously resided in the United States since June 15, 2007 up to the present time:
 - a. Medical records
 - b. Photos from quinceañera
 - c. Library card
 - d. Receipts for sending money abroad
 - e. Tax return
 - f. Bills paid
 - g. Birth records of children

- IV. I was physically present in the United States on June 15, 2012 and at the time of making this request for consideration of deferred action:
 - a. Receipt from June 2012
 - b. Summer school program registration
 - c. Utility bill

Just one piece of evidence can be enough if it proves that you meet the requirement (example: school transcripts)

If you entered without inspection at the border, you do not have to provide documents to show the lack of immigration status. You can write something like this sentence (a) if you choose.

- V. I entered without inspection before June 15, 2012 or did not have lawful immigration status as of June 15, 2012.
 - a. *“I entered the United States without lawful status and therefore I am unable to provide any evidence of my immigration status.”*
 - b. *Copy of expired visa or I-94 card*
- VI. I am currently in school, have graduated or obtained a certificate of completion from high school, have obtained a GED, or served in the military.
 - a. *School transcript*
 - b. *High school diploma*
 - c. *GED certificate*

If you have any criminal convictions, talk to an immigration attorney to help you write a statement here or provide further explanation with your application.

- VII. I have not been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, three or more other misdemeanors and do not otherwise pose a threat to national security or public safety.
 - a. *“I have not been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, or other misdemeanors and therefore I am unable to provide any evidence of criminal records.”*
 - b. *Court records for Driving without a License, and receipt of payment of fine*

- VIII. Other evidence in support of my application
 - a. *Birth certificates of children in the U.S.*
 - b. *School awards*
 - c. *Medical conditions needing treatment*
 - d. *Letters of support*

This is not necessary, but might be a place to offer any other evidence of why you should be granted DACA.
