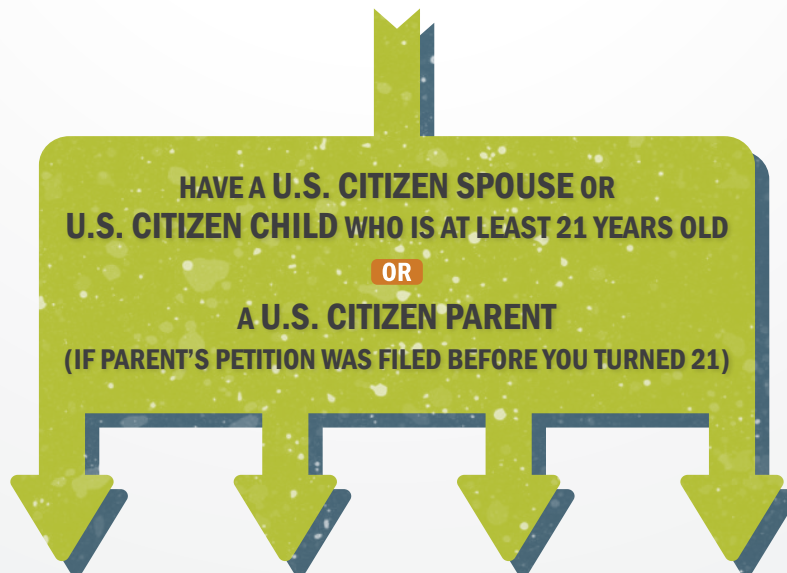



PATHS TO FAMILY-BASED GREEN CARDS FOR TPS HOLDERS



NOTE THAT TPS HOLDERS WHO DO NOT QUALIFY FOR FAMILY-BASED GREEN CARDS MAY STILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR OTHER FORMS OF IMMIGRATION RELIEF.

¹ THERE ARE GOOD ARGUMENTS THAT YOU CAN STILL GET A GREEN CARD IF YOU LIVE IN THESE STATES EVEN IF YOUR TPS HAS ALREADY EXPIRED, BUT THE LAW IS CURRENTLY UNCLEAR.
